Please accept my best wishes for an enjoyable and memorable reunion.



Our sincere thanks to Pravin Mehta for the endless hours he spent on ensuring that the seating arrangements were taken care of and for the handling of the souvenir gifts.


Thank you to Rashmi Mehta for all the work he put into the photography of all of the committee members.
